1923 Correspondence between SPAB (Powys) and the Rector regarding the restoration of the Church. SPAB asked for more information and any architect's plans and reports.

1928 Powys visited the Church 'to draw up a report on the building and to examine its condition and make an estimate of what its repair would cost'. 4-page Report dated 30/11/28 (scanned)

SPAB Annual Report (scanned)

4/3/29 The Diocesan Registry wrote to Powys authorising the 'execution of the works of repair' and the latter contacted S Clarke, Builder at Sturminster Newton who began work on the roof. There was correspondence between SPAB, the Salisbury Diocesan Advisory Committee and Clarke, who undertook repairs to the Church until August 1931, when the work was completed. The chief works were the repair of the roof and of the seating, and a slight extension to the churchyard on the north side.

November 1931 Summary by Powys of work done at the Church in a letter sent to Salisbury Diocesan Advisory Committee. (5 pages scanned).
